Event Terms & Conditions



By booking to attend a Talking Maths in Public (TMiP) event, you confirm that you accept these terms and conditions, so please read them carefully. TMiP reserves the right to amend these terms and conditions for future events at any time. If TMiP runs an event in collaboration with another organisation, additional T&Cs may apply. This will be made clear to those booking onto such events.

Bookings on behalf of a party of people

If you are booking on behalf of a party, you accept these terms and conditions on behalf of all members of your party and are responsible for all payments due from the party. You also accept responsibility for gaining each person's consent to supply their details to us.

Event changes

The Talking Maths in Public (TMiP) board of trustees reserve the right to make any alterations to speakers, event content, event timing and/or event venue, and will make all reasonable efforts to contact participants to inform them of any changes. TMiP will not be held liable for any additional costs incurred by participants due to changes made to the advertised event.

Filming and recording

By attending this event, audience members consent to being filmed, recorded and photographed. Audience members grant the TMiP team the right to use recordings of any type made of their attendance in any and all media, and by means of publicity and promotion relating to the TMiP event and future activities. Attendees who do not wish for their likeness to be used in this way should specifically contact the organisers to clarify this, and they can be removed from any materials before sharing. Event attendees agree to adhere to the photography and recording code of conduct for the event (available on the website).

Refunds

The TMiP board of trustees will only guarantee a refund if a TMiP event is cancelled by us. Our liability in this case will be limited to the face value of your event tickets.

You may request a refund for TMiP event bookings if you cancel your booking more than two weeks prior to the date of the event. The TMiP committee may grant full or partial refunds after this date at our discretion. Refunds must be requested online via our ticketing platform (users may need to log into their personal account to request this).

Remote attendee conference packs will be sent out to UK attendees in advance of TMiP conferences, and it may not be possible to offer full refunds to UK attendees less than one month before the event date. This will be dependent on whether the conference pack has already been posted. The TMiP board of trustees cannot be held liable if a posted conference pack does not arrive with the intended recipient.

Bursary recipients

For events where bursaries are offered to cover full or partial events costs, applicants should wait to hear the result of their application before booking a place at the conference. If they have booked an event place in advance of being awarded a bursary place, they will need to cancel this booking and make a new booking via the appropriate method for bursary recipients.

Children

Unless otherwise stated, TMiP events are not specifically aimed at children or young people aged under the age of 18. However, we will accept applications to attend our events from those aged 16-17 who can demonstrate an interest in communicating maths to the public, with parental consent. For some events, such as in-person conferences which run over several days, young people aged 16 and 17 may need to be accompanied by a parent/carer. Parents/carers should get in touch with us to discuss the suitability of each event and for a tailored booking link.

In order to allow parents/carers to attend our events, children and young people aged 15 and under are able to attend if they are accompanied by a parent or carer, but should not be left unattended at any time during a TMiP event. This is because we will not have the appropriate supervision arrangements in place to oversee any lone children or young people. Parents/carers should contact us in advance if they need to bring their children with them to a TMiP event.
