If you need someone else to book your ticket for TMiP 2021 on your behalf (usually, because they're paying for it), they will need to complete the order form when they book. When they're asked for the details of the person the ticket is for, they can input your email address and a copy of the ticket will be sent to you (with a button for you to 'Claim Your Order').
